### 5<sup>th</sup> dimension ego

Ego is a set of mental functions that enable human beings to live in harmony with the outside world. It is the organizing, balancing and adapting component of personality.

### 6<sup>th</sup> dimension superego

Over time, a part of the ego evolves in relation to socialization and values, forming the superego layer. The superego introduces

the concept of morality to the impulses sent by the id, and accordingly, it covers up by delaying or ignoring requests that would be deemed inappropriate.

### And the 7<sup>th</sup> dimension Id Id

The etymology of the Latin word id is based on the work "Das Buch vom Es" written by Georg Groddeck, one of the pioneers of early psychosomatic medicine. In the Latin language, the word "id" is used as a neutral third person pronoun.

The id represents the mind's most primitive need drives. The sexual and aggressive impulses that occur in human psychology are shaped around the id; It is the basis of our desires such as hunger, sexuality and excretion. According to Freud, a newborn baby consists of the pure id, seeking immediate satisfaction of physiological needs. Imagine a baby crying until he's bruised because he's hungry, he doesn't know what it is; but it needs food and wants it to happen immediately.

The issue that needs to be emphasized here is that the biggest reason why it is said that human behavior is a tool that puts pressure on others today, and that his behavior cannot be understood by others (his attitudes changed when he took office, we did not recognize him as such) is that he feels that he has reached the environment where he will satisfy the uneasiness brought by his childhood trauma with his office by persecuting others. For this reason, he does not hesitate to exhibit the position he has achieved, especially to his gifted colleagues and candidate candidates. These

people do not act within the idea of society. Ignoring their actions by their peers causes them to engage in more dangerous behaviors.
